LORD'S TABLE LITURGY

Leader: In threshold places, where endings meet beginnings,

we listen backwards as we move forward.

What can we learn from the years past -

from how evil played its cards,

or from relationships gained and lost?

ALL: We look back and lament the evil of the insurrection at our nation's capitol three years ago this week. We grieve the ways in which white supremacy and Christian nationalism have harmed us all. We lament the fractures in relationships throughout the land.

Leader: Let us pray to the Lord, who is our refuge and stronghold. For the health and well-being of our nation and world, that all who are fearful and anxious may be at peace and free from worry: Lord, hear us,

ALL: Lord, graciously hear us.

Leader: What brought you deep delight, when everything was swirling?

To whom were you able to turn to and who challenged you to grow?

Individually and collectively,

none of us are the same.

For some of these changes we weep and for others we rejoice

but from each we carry something forward

- a feeling, a lesson, a memory, a challenge, a call to solidarity...

ALL: Collectively, we acknowledge a closing and an opening;

A fresh start that offers only as much meaning as we need from it.

Inviting us not to wage war on ourselves,

committing to that which calls us,

letting ourselves be lured by the Sacred

in the direction of our most powerful becoming.

Leader: For our homes and families, our school communities and young people, and all who need to hear new words of possibility in this new year: Lord, hear us,

ALL: Lord, graciously hear us.

Leader: Make only resolutions that will lead to more flourishing of life, yours and others.

Reject individualistic notions of success (or "failure")

and channel your growing

in the directions

ALL: of what we can create

of what we can divest from

of what we can abolish

of what we must claim

of what we must fight

of what we can become.

Leader: For a blessing on our local community, that our neighborhoods may be places of trust and friendship, where all are known and cared for in the process of becoming: Lord, hear us,

ALL: Lord, graciously hear us.

Leader: God of new beginnings, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, as we Gather with you and feast this day.

ALL: We tell the story that God invites each of us into: Christ came to dwell among us; Christ lived to show us the way; Christ died to set us free from sin; Christ was raised to break the power of death and will come again to bring us the wholeness for which we long.

Leader: Where two or more of us are gathered, O Lord, there you have promised to be.

ALL: And here we are.

Leader: And so, here are you. Take joy, O King, in our feast. Nothing good and right and true will be lost forever. All good things will be restored. Feast and be reminded!

ALL: Take joy, O King!

Leader: Now beloved, prepare your hearts and give yourself wholly to this celebration of joy, to the glad company of saints, to the comforting fellowship of the Spirit, and to the abiding presence of Christ who is seated among us both as our host and as our honored guest. Covid Guidelines: We are in a season of preparing for possible gathering changes due to the resurgence of Covid. Gatherings may look a little different according to the needs of our leaders if Covid affects them or their teams. We ask that everyone remain flexible if and/or when this is the case. **If a gathering is going to be virtual, we will send an email by 8am on Sunday**, or earlier. We are also asking that those who have tested positive or develop symptoms not attend the gathering in person, but join online via Zoom. If you have been exposed, you can follow the guidelines from the CDC by using this <u>calculator</u> to determine what are your best precautions to take.

Land Acknowledgement. We acknowledge that the land on which we gather for worship was stolen from Native peoples, who were driven out of the area and of their native lands by genocide, force (through broken treaties and laws imposed upon their nation), and systematic disposession. The Myaamiaki, Kaskaskia, and Kickapoo peoples* and their sovereign Nations have cared for, and are deeply a part of, this land - past, present, and future.
