Gospel: Is Our Good News Big Enough?

The Good News We Expected

What Jesus' Hearers Expected...

Israel hoped for someone to restore their country to what they were meant to be—flourishing, independent and set apart. They wanted a conquering king, not someone to rescue them spiritually or individually. The arrival of this king would have been good news.

What We Expect...

If Israel missed the point by making the good news all about their own political situation, we've swung the other way, making it only about our personal spiritual lives. In Semitic thinking, there was no separation between the physical and the spiritual, so any good news would have to be holistic.

The Good News We Got

The New Testament is clear: we have to look at Jesus to understand good news.

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me. He has sent me to preach good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the prisoners and recovery of sight to the blind, to liberate the oppressed, and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor. -Luke 4:18-19

When God offers Good News, it's truly good, in every sense of the word—spiritual, physical, social, environmental. The gospel—the good news—is that God has acted through Jesus' life, death and resurrection (1 Corinthians 15:1-6) to bring all of creation to a state of *shalom*, or oneness (oneness with self, others, God and all of creation)—back to the way God originally intended the world to be.

Sharing the gospel isn't awkwardly telling someone about your spiritual beliefs. It's living in a way that lines up with what God is doing in the world thought Jesus, which occasionally involves articulating your faith.
