COMMUNITY CONFESSION

Leader: What is confession? ALL: An unburdening, a letting go, truth telling. Leader: To whom do we confess? ALL: We confess to the One we call God, our Creator, our Redeemer, We confess to the One who loves us. Leader: What do we confess this day? ALL: We confess the wrong we have done and the hurt we have caused. We confess the good we have not done, and the sin we have not claimed. We confess that we live more like ourselves and less like Christ. Leader: Let us now make our silent confession.

Silent Confession

Leader: Let us come before God with the whole of our lives, the good, the bad, and the holy. Let us pray together: **ALL: On this day, we remember the violence that struck towers and buildings. The destruction of lives, loved ones and neighbors lost. We lament that the collective trauma unleashed hate across the land that continued to inflict harm, through words and actions.** Leader: Jesus shows us another way - a way that embraces the stranger and dismantles fear. Christ binds us to one another, building one another up in love, making way for peace. May our lives be patterned not by the oppressive nature of supremacy, but by the liberating nature of wonder and beauty. ALL: Holy God, at times we have delusions of grandeur,

and we forgot to see what is small -

the falling leaf that holds the beauty of creation;

the kind word that is a testament to grace;

the child who is vital not only for the future but for the present.

Help us to remember our place in this world you made, to give thanks for things great and small, to be humble and hopeful. And hear us now as we open our heart to you.

Leader: Friends, this is the Good News:

In Jesus Christ, we are forgiven! And we are not only forgiven, we are also freed. Let us greet the world as people made new in Christ.

BLESSING AND PASSING THE PEACE

Adults: The Lord be with you!

Children and Kids Ministry Leader: And also with you!

During this time we greet one another, recognizing that we are all a part of the body, as PreK-5th grade children are led to their ministry space. Younger children and youth remain, and are welcome, in the Gathering.
