## **Liturgy: Asset Mapping**

***work that transforms our world for the benefit of our neighbors***

*Liturgy* ("the work of the people") is a work of worship that is supported by proper gifting, which transforms our world for the benefit of our neighbors.

Trinity has been accepted as one of 30 congregations in central Indiana to participate in a one-year, grant writing process at the end of which we are invited to submit a grant application to the Center for Congregations, to support a new ministry within our greater community—among our neighbors.

Mark 6:35-44 and "How many loaves do you have?"

Asset Mapping is a process that transform our thinking from the mindset of deficiency to the mindset of abundance, from seeing the cup half empty to seeing the cup half full.  
(Luther Snow, author of *The Power of Asset Mapping*)

### **Step One: Individually Identify Assets (2-3 min.)**

Write down two or three gifts/assets you possess or have perceived in the Trinity community.

Here are four general types of assets to help you brainstorm:

- Relational (networks, organizations, influence)
- Economic (financial, physical, ownership of services or spaces)
- Intellectual (education, professional knowledge, expertise)
- Passions/Interests (what you love to do, experience-based callings)

Be specific and be creative!

- Specific: "100 seats in the sanctuary" is a more precise economic asset than "the building."
- Creative: sometimes the zaniest gifts and assets can spark the most compelling ideas!

### **Step Two: Share Your Thoughts (12 min.)**

In groups of ten, briefly name what you wrote down individually. Spend the bulk of this time considering those assets that were named together: what overlaps? What patterns do you see emerging?

### **Step Three: Finding Themes Together (12 min.)**

Return to your original seat. Each of the group facilitators will report the patterns your group identified. As you listen, consider adding to the list of assets you made in step one.

### **Step Four: Vote with your Feet (before you leave-!)**

Write your name on your sheet of paper and place it in the basket under the general direction that resonates with you the most. Remember, these are not binding covenants! Simply try to envision which direction your individual gifts, communal experience, and life situation seem to "fit."
