Luke 4.14-30 (First Nations Version)

PRAYER OF THE PEOPLE & LORD'S TABLE LITURGY

Leader: Loving God, we pause to breathe you in - to welcome you among us.

ALL: We welcome you into our homes, into our lives, into our hearts, asking that you would make your presence known to us both today and throughout the coming week.

Leader: We thank you, Lord, for another day of life, for this new year, for the promise of a miraculous, persistent, "won't-abandon-us-no-matter what" eternal hope, despite the chaos, the disorder, the destruction we face.

ALL: Gracious God, we humbly offer prayers of support to the many suffering and hurting in our world.

Leader: For the lonely and heartbroken,

ALL: we pray for your comfort and your peace.

Leader: For the sick and the tired,

ALL: we pray for your grace and your strength.

Leader: For the persecuted and defenseless,

ALL: we pray for your stamina and your justice.

Leader: For the confused and the disoriented,

ALL: we pray for your wisdom and guidance.

Leader: Mysterious Creator, we're standing on the brink of what has been a full year - emotionally, physically, financially, spiritually demanding. Every day the news, the notifications, the tweets - moments of anxiety around politics and pandemic so thick, so intense, it's hard to breathe. There are moments, dear Lord, when many of us feel as if we're left with nothing. No more patience, no more energy, no more fight, no more hope and even sometimes no more love.

ALL: And God we need you to sustain us, to revive us, to hold us, to reorient us, to call us to your marvelous service in love of neighbor and in bringing about your kingdom which knows no sickness, no suffering, no delusion, no injustice, no end.

Leader: Patient God, in this troubling time of political division, uncertainty, amid the shouts, the name-calling, the retorts, the blaming, we ask that you would teach us to listen.

ALL: Teach us to listen to those far from us - the whisper of the hopeless, the plea of the forgotten, the cry of the anguished.

Leader: Teach us to listen, O God, to ourselves.

ALL: Help us to be less afraid to trust the voice inside.

Leader: Teach us to listen, Holy Spirit,

ALL: for your voice — in busyness and in boredom, in certainty and doubt, in noise and in silence.

Leader: Now, as we come to your ever-expanding table, teach us, oh Lord,

ALL: to listen, to hear, to live the words that Christ himself taught us when he prayed...

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.

Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

 $For thine is the {\it kingdom} \ and \ the \ power \ and \ the \ glory \ for ever.$

The Leadership Team has approved the 2022 budget. You will notice a few changes in the budget compared to last year. If you have questions about the 2022 budget and any changes, you may contact any member of the Leadership Team or go straight to the Treasurer - Jay Howard (jay@indytrinity.org). If you have questions about accounting, please contact Matthew Pierce (finance@indytrinity.org) who handles the finances. "Community Equity Funds" at a total of \$6000 for the year are now designated for what we as a congregation want to fund in the community that invests in equity building, reparations (as some might call it), etc. Before these funds are dispersed, we will hold a family meeting (the 6th of February; stay tuned for details about that) to begin conversations about how these funds will be invested in work that is already happening in the greater community.

Proposed Bylaw Revisions. You should have received an email outlining proposed bylaw changes for final review and adoption by the Leadership Team (on January 11th). The revisions to the Trinity Bylaws reflect the establishment of a Financial Subcommittee that will serve to advise the Leadership Team on matters related to Trinity's finances. More broadly, revisions are proposed to clarify procedures by which various Subcommittees may be established as the need arises. These changes are aimed at providing greater flexibility to form (and, as appropriate, disband) Subcommittees for various purposes without needing to formally revise the bylaws *every* time the need for a Subcommittee arises.
