Leader: Loving God, we pause to breathe you in - to welcome you among us.

Leader: For the confused and the disoriented,

ALL: we pray for your wisdom and guidance.

Leader: Mysterious Creator, we often stand on the brink of being overwhelmed - emotionally, physically, financially, spiritually. There are moments, dear Lord, when many of us feel as if we're left with nothing. No more patience, no more energy, no more fight, no more hope and even sometimes no more love.
