LORD'S TABLE LITURGY

We are thrilled to announce the award of **our first Community Grant recipient of 2023**, <u>Community Food Box Project</u> (\$500). Since 2016, Community Food Box Project has refurbished newspaper distribution boxes and turned them into little pantries for people to take food when they need. To date, CFBP has installed 74 boxes around the state of Indiana.

Equity Funds. Rolling submissions for 2023 Equity Funds will be accepted in phases: through May 7th and then again through November 5th. This <u>form</u> is to be used to submit proposals and **taken to Community Conversations scheduled for May 14th** and November 12th. After those conversations, more solidified proposals (discerned through the larger group conversation) will then be taken to the Leadership Team for final disbursement requests.
